



## **Stuart S. Janney III**

**Born:** August 31, 1948 in Baltimore, Maryland

**Residence:** Butler, Maryland

**Family:** wife, Lynn; children, Emily and Matthew.

**Education:** University of North Carolina-Chapel Hill, B.A. and University of Maryland, J.D.

**Business:** Has been the chairman of Bessemer Trust Co., a wealth management and investment advisory firm for high net worth families, and Bessemer Securities Corp. since 1995. His great grandfather, Henry Phipps, was a partner of steel magnate Andrew Carnegie and was the founder of Bessemer Trust.

- **Racing:** The Phipps family has been prominent in American racing and breeding since his grandmother, Gladys Mills Phipps, formed Wheatley Stable with her brother Ogden Mills in 1926.
- Wheatley Stable bred 90 stakes winners and 11 champions.
- Among the champions Wheatley bred are Hall of Famers Seabiscuit and Bold Ruler, the sire of Secretariat.
- Janney's homebred Ironicus, who descends from Bold Ruler, is a strong contender for the 2016 Breeders' Cup Mile.
- Ironicus was forced to miss the 2015 Mile when he was found to have a fracture of the canon bone in his right foreleg two weeks after setting the course record (1.38.54) in the Bernard Baruch-G2 at Saratoga. He underwent surgery and was out for the year.
- Ironicus came back strong in 2016, winning the Fort Marcy-G3 in May in his first start back. In June he was also second in the Woodford Reserve Manhattan-G1, and was a fast-closing second in the Shadwell Turf Mile-G1 at Keeneland in his last.
- Ironicus, out of Meghan's Joy by Distorted Humor, is a half-brother to On Leave, winner of the Sands Point-G2 and the Riskaverse Stakes in 2016, and graded stakes winners Hunting and Norumbega.
- In partnership with his cousin Ogden Mills "Dinny" Phipps, Janney won the 2013 Kentucky Derby with Orb, the family's first victory in America's most famous race. Orb carried Janney's silks.

- Through the years, Derby horses owned by members of the Phipps family had finished second twice (Easy Goer in 1989, and Dapper Dan in 1965), and third (Awe Inspiring in 1989). "It's really the culmination of horse racing and I am thrilled to be here today," Dinny Phipps said after the Derby. Janney said: "I just couldn't be more delighted that we're doing this together."
- Introduced to racing through his parents, Stuart and Barbara, who owned the champion filly Ruffian.
- One of the most beloved fillies of all-time, Ruffian won her first 10 starts before she tragically broke down during a 1975 match race with Kentucky Derby winner Foolish Pleasure and was euthanized. She is a member of the Hall of Fame.
- The Janneys also owned Icecapade and Private Terms.
- Hall of Famer Shug McGaughey is his private trainer and his racehorses are based at Fair Hill Training Center in Maryland.
- In 1988 inherited the family stable and moved the breeding operation from Maryland to Claiborne Farm in Paris, Kentucky.
- Janney's most successful runner before Orb was homebred Coronado's Quest, who won the Haskell Invitational-G1 and Travers-G1 in 1998. Coronado's Quest also captured the Dwyer-G2 and Riva Ridge-G2 at three, plus three graded races during his 2-year-old season.
- The Janney-bred Coronado's Quest, owned in partnership with Stonerside Stable, accounted for Janney's first Breeders' Cup start, finishing fifth in the 1998 Breeders' Cup Classic.
- His other Breeders' Cup starters were Hymn Book, 5<sup>th</sup> in the 2013 Dirt Mile, Carriage Trail, who was fourth in the 2008 Ladies' Classic, and Air Support, who was ninth in the 2010 Juvenile Turf. Carriage Trail was run in partnership with the Phipps Stable..
- Enjoyed success in 2012 with homebreds Hymn Book and Data Link, both also trained by McGaughey.
- Hymn Book won the Donn Handicap-G1.
- Data Link was retired to stud at Claiborne Farm in Oct. 2013 after leading Janney's stable the previous two seasons. He won four graded turf stakes, including the 2012 Maker's 46 Mile Stakes-G1.
- Owns approximately 80 horses, some in partnership with Phipps Stable or Seth Hancock of Claiborne Farm.

- Serves as the chairman of the Johns Hopkins Applied Physics Lab and a trustee of Johns Hopkins Medicine and Johns Hopkins University.
- Is a former member of the Board of Trustees of the New York Racing Association and serves on the board of Keeneland. He is vice-chairman of The Jockey Club and serves as chairman of The Jockey Club's Thoroughbred Safety Committee. A past chairman of the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association (TOBA), he remains active with the organization as vice-chairman.
- Is also the chairman of the Johns Hopkins Applied Physics Lab and a trustee of Johns Hopkins Medicine and Johns Hopkins University and a board member of the Maryland Zoological Society.
- An attorney by trade, he holds a B.A. from the University of North Carolina-Chapel Hill and a J.D. from the University of Maryland.
