Footnotes

MAXIMUM TWIST was taken toward the outside early on, was roused three wide on the turn, swung out leaving the bend, carried out to path eight into the lane, gained the lead with a sixteenth left, drifted out under left-handed pressure with fifty yards left, was corrected and held MOUNTAIN MOON safe. MOUNTAIN MOON disputed the pace just outside FLYER BE QUICK, drifted out to path five entering the lane, battled on near even terms the last furlong, took over second nearing the wire but could not get past MAXIMUM TWIST. PERKINSVILLE pressed the early speed from three wide, drifted out to path seven into the lane, gained a slight advantage but lacked the extra kick deep stretch. FLYER BE QUICK dueled for the lead from inside, floated out some entering the stretch, tried hard but did not have enough left in the waning yards. JAWBREAKER JACK void of speed from outside, was four wide into the turn, lost ground fanning widest for the drive and made up minor ground late. SUNLAND SOUVENIR chased from between horses in the back, was two to four wide through the turn, angled in midstretch and offered no rally. TOM TUFF was a contender from inside for more than a half mile, fanned to path three for the stretch run and was empty.
