HIGH RIDGE RUNNER advanced from outside to share the lead three wide on the second turn, tried to lug in as he dueled for the lead in the lane, had a narrow advantage midstretch and held sway. JADED DREAMS was rated from inside, kept the rail through the second turn, rallied in the stretch, was steadied in tight quarters nearing the sixteenth marker and slowly closing the gap on HIGH REDGE RUNNER late. AMOROSO vied for the early lead between horses, moved ahead on the backstretch, was challenged from outside on the second bend, slowly forced in as he fought to keep the lead in the stretch and gradually yielded inside the final sixteenth. MINT MOHITO gradually angled out on the backstretch, lost ground five wide through the second turn, ran evenly in the lane but was clearly best of the rest. WHOS LAZY was a contender between rivals through the early going, four wide taking the second bend then flattened out for the drive. HAPPY JACK failed to menace in a ground-saving trip. MAGNIFICENT STORM steadied back from a narrowing path shortly after the break, showed no speed staying well off the inside and had little left for the drive.
