INVISIBLE STAR, reserved outside a rival tracking just off the second flight to the backstretch, switched out nearing the far turn while commencing a steady, three wide advance, drew on terms with the leader in late stages and wrested command from that foe to prevail under right handed pressure. MR. SEABRA broke sharply, dictated the pace on a clear margin racing into the far turn, shifted out a bit when challenged by the winner in late stages and just yielded to that foe late. JAYBIRD'S MIRACLE, caught four wide between foes in the opening stages, angled inwards a bit to track the pacesetter racing just off the second flight, continued with interest between rivals into upper stretch and earned a share. MICHAEL MOE hopped at the start, shifted out five deep entering the first turn while quickly gaining a contending position, tracked just off the pacesetter to the far turn but weakened nearing upper stretch. WEEKEND PASS, reserved saving ground in the opening half, swung out four wide nearing upper stretch to gain some position but made no impression on the leaders. DAKOTA RIDGE tracked the leaders unhurried along the inside in midpack but came up empty racing through the far turn. RED PLAYS ROUGH ducked outwards at the start, was collected quickly to track just off the pacesetter near the inside to the backstretch, couldn't produce a closing response and steadily faded nearing upper stretch. JOE THE GENTLEMAN, reserved in hand along the inside early, never mounted a serious challenge.
