Footnotes

GOLD LEGION was settled in hand while angling to the inside in early stages, shifted out on the bend to circle the field four wide between foes, drew on terms with BOBBY SANDS in upper stretch and just edged that foe in a prolonged drive. The latter attended the pace under some reserve between foes in the opening stages, edged forward to a narrow advantage after six furlongs, dueled grudgingly inside the winner through the last furlong and just failed to contain that foe. OCEAN ACE stalked just off the the first under reserve along the inside racing to the bend, briefly awaited an opening after six furlongs, came through to split foes nearing the furlong marker and continued well enough to secure a share inside a rival late. UNO CHAPO tracked the leaders unhurried from out of striking distance early, commenced a five wide advance in tandem with the winner racing through the turn but failed to match terms with that foe in the last quarter, flattening out late. LION'S CIRCLE went up from the break to dictate the pace along the inside, dueled for command into upper stretch and gave way. FRANK'S TIME, in close attendance to the pace three deep in the opening half, pressed between foes racing into the bend and gave way abruptly in upper stretch.
