Footnotes

CAP'N NICK, prominent between foes from the outset, attended a rival's pace under light rating racing to the bend, increased the tempo nearing upper stretch to gain a slim advantage, then continued resolutely to hold safe the challenge of CATFEINATED to the end under firm right handed urging to gamely prevail. The latter was rated between foes in the second flight racing to the bend, shifted out three deep leaving the turn while commencing his challenge, drew on terms with the winner leaving the furlong marker but was outfinished. SHEDROW HERO broke outwards bumping FIRST TRUMPET, was righted to track the leaders along the inside in second flight racing into the turn, shifted off the rail entering upper stretch to bid between foes but had no final kick. STAR OF PARADISE settled well off the pace, was guided to the inside, saved ground on the bend gradually gathering momentum, was steadied out of tight quarters nearing the furlong marker but continued with interest to improve his placing. BOURBON TRAIL tracked just off the first flight three deep racing to the bend, couldn't maintain that position after a half and gave way in upper stretch. DEMIGOD settled off the second flight racing outside a rival and never mounted a serious challenge. FIRST TRUMPET, bumped at the start, was urged to dispute the pace racing nearest the rail into the bend, couldn't match the winner leaving the furlong marker and gave out late.
