Footnotes

KIP BERRIES broke readily to gain a narrow advantage while shifting to the rail, dictated the pace inside foes in the opening quarter on her own courage, forged clear racing into upper stretch and held sway on a commanding margin to the end under firm handling. SWEET LEMON CHELLO was settled outside foes in the opening stages, angled four wide racing into upper stretch and found her best stride in the last furlong to prove best of the others. READY TO UNLEASH broke a step slowly, was urged to terms with the first flight three deep between foes, vied for command outside the winner through the turn but proved no match in the last quarter while narrowly prevailing for a share. BENT MISSILE joined the pace four deep in the opening stages, pressed the issue three wide on the turn to upper stretch and steadily weakened in late stages. VINDICED GYPSY tracked just off the first flight along the rail racing to the bend, saved ground to upper stretch but lacked the needed closing response. ITZACOLDCASE bobbled at the start, was settled between foes tracking the leaders from out of striking distance racing to the turn and never gained contention. DISTORSIONADA was a brief factor prompting the pacesetter between foes in the opening quarter but emptied out early.
