Footnotes

MALTESE DOG, forwardly placed while shifting a bit off the inside in the opening quarter, moved to wrest command after three furlongs, dictated the pace on a narrow margin racing into the turn, forged clear in upper stretch and held sway to the end under right handed pressure. DRUMBLARE stalked just off the first flight in the opening quarter, moved to press the issue racing into the turn but couldn't match the winner in the final quarter while holding for place honors. NINTH CLIENT settled inside foes off the second flight, advanced to contention along the rail after the opening half, couldn't gain terms with the top pair but continued evenly for a share. MASSECUITE settled near the inside in the opening stages and continued evenly between foes racing into the stretch. TIMELESS FACTS tracked the leaders four deep in the second flight racing to the turn and never gained contention while continuing evenly outside a rival into the stretch. OLIVER was settled between foes early and never mounted a serious challenge. GRAY was urged to contention outside foes in the opening quarter but was spent after a half.
