Footnotes

MUNDY moved to terms with a rival on the lead racing near the rail while attending that foe's tempo in the opening quarter, steadily increased the tempo racing into upper stretch, shook clear nearing the furlong marker and extended her margin under firm encouragement. KITTEN'S KITTEN broke sharply to gain a clear advantage, prompted the pace outside a rival racing into the bend, couldn't match terms with that foe after six furlongs but prevailed grudgingly for place honors. COURTESY CALL worked her way inside tracking the leaders from just out of striking distance in the opening stages, continued as part of the second flight on the bend, came through along the inside to challenge in upper stretch, couldn't gain terms with the winner and was outfinished for second. CROSS EYED MARY, held up just off the first flight in the opening stages, shifted out three wide on the turn while making a brief bid but flattened out entering upper stretch. THE REAL MAYO reared at the start, then ducked outwards losing position to the field and never gained contention. ONE STAR broke outwards, was guided to the outside after the opening quarter to track off the second flight racing to the turn but never mounted a serious challenge.
