Footnotes

STAN THE TAP MAN, off a step behind the leaders at the break, was urged to the lead from between foes in the opening furlong to gain a clear advantage, held sway on a clear margin into upper stretch and was kept to firm encouragement to hold safe the challenge of BANK ACCOUNT in the closing stages. The latter, forwardly placed between foes from the outset, tracked the pacesetter between foes in the second flight after the opening furlong, made steady progress racing into upper stretch to close the gap in late stages but was always second best. CHURUBUSCO settled off the second flight outside a rival in the opening stages, angled to the inside entering the turn and continued to improve his position racing into the stretch while making some mild progress to close the gap on the leaders and earn a share. LUCKY MERLOT, reserved in last in the opening stages, swung out four wide racing into upper stretch and passed some tiring rivals. WATTS FERRY tracked the pacesetter inside foes as part of the second flight racing to the bend but offered no closing bid. THIEF tracked off the second flight along the inside in the opening quarter, angled outside foes racing through the turn while being urged to advance but came up empty after a half. ALABAMA CLAY was a brief factor racing four, then three wide in the second flight racing to the turn but steadily faded nearing upper stretch.
