Footnotes

HELICOPTER was settled just off the leaders saving ground in the opening stages, moved readily to a stalking position inside a rival on the backstretch, came through inside the leader to challenge for command nearing midstretch and prevailed under hand urging. SNAPPHOK tracked just off and outside the second flight to the backstretch, swung four wide entering upper stretch and continued well enough to earn the place. MR. SEABRA broke outwards bumping MILES AND MILES, was quickly righted to secure the lead, dictated the pace under rating just off the inside to the far turn but couldn't sustain his momentum. MILES AND MILES, bumped at the start, recovered quickly to stalk outside the pacesetter to the far turn, bid three wide entering upper stretch but flattened out late. BEAT THE FREEZE was settled outside foes in the opening stages but couldn't produce the needed closing bid. LACER, a bit rank along the inside early, dropped out of contention entering the far turn.
