SET IN STONE threw his head at the start while breaking a bit awkwardly, was roused to join the pace outside foes racing through the backstretch, went clear entering the bend to open a commanding advantage after a half and was kept to steady pressure to maintain a clear margin to the end. RICH CITY DUDE tracked the pace unhurried early, made steady progress along the inside racing into the stretch and bid inside a rival to prevail for place honors. J. PA broke sharply, was held up off the leaders in the opening stages, angled to the inside on the turn while moving into second, chased the leader to upper stretch and was outfinished for second while never menacing the winner. MR. ROESSINK tracked the pacesetter in second flight a bit off the inside racing to the bend and continued evenly between foes to late stages. TIMELY PURSUIT, held up out of tight quarters at the start, angled to the inside, came through close quarters along the rail racing through the turn but had no closing bid. KING A. J. settled outside foes in early stages, swung four wide racing into upper stretch but lacked the needed late response. CATCH THE TRAIN, unruly in the gate prior to the start, flashed brief pace disputing the lead inside the winner in the opening quarter but emptied out after three furlongs.
