Footnotes

MISS TWENTY ONE broke outwards bumping SIXTYSIX MARGAUX, was taken in hand to be reserved along the inside, saved ground on the bend while moving steadily to striking position, shifted off the inside to split foes nearing the furlong marker and responded to firm handling to wrest command and go well clear. COUNT THE CHANGE was settled well off the pace in early stages, swung five wide entering upper stretch and made steady progress late to secure the place. LOSE NONE, reserved just off the leaders while just off the inside, shifted out to bid three deep entering upper stretch, pressed the issue to the furlong marker outside the winner but had no final response. ITALIAN REVOLUTION was urged to dispute the pace inside from the break, dueled for command to midstretch and gave way. BOOGIE RED tracked the leaders outside a rival in second flight, was fanned four wide nearing upper stretch but steadily faded from contention. SIXTYSIX MARGAUX, bumped at the start, was quickly righted, then urged to prompt the pace outside a rival racing to the turn but gave way after a half.
