Footnotes

GIANT SHIFT, unhurried between foes racing well off the second flight in the opening half, made steady progress splitting foes three deep leaving the midway point of the far turn, angled out five wide while being roused to challenge in upper stretch and just edged CARTOUCHE in time under strong handling. The latter gained a position just off the second flight racing to the backstretch, shifted out to advance to contention racing four wide through the far turn, continued in that path into upper stretch while make solid late progress and was just outkicked by the winner. BERLIOZ, forwardly placed three deep in the opening stages, steadily moved to terms with the pacesetter after the opening quarter, attended the pace under some reserve racing to the second bend, edged forward when roused racing into upper stretch and just failed to contain the top pair. PERFECT CASTING settled outside foes in the opening half, split foes four wide leaving the far turn, was shuffled a bit when losing his path to the eventual winner racing into upper stretch but continued willingly to the end five deep between foes. MANZANA, reserved along the inside in early stages, shifted out five wide entering the far turn while making some brief progress, was fanned six wide into the stretch and steadily faded in the drive. TURNPIKE TOMMY, pulling his way along while caught four wide racing into the first turn, continued in the second flight while making some progress three deep between foes racing through the far turn but weakened racing through the stretch. DOCTOR CAL settled between foes off the inside in the opening half, switched out nearing upper stretch and made an effort to improve his position racing seven wide through the stretch. UNO CHAPO settled near the inside in the opening stages and never mounted a serious challenge. SHIP'S CABIN, held up between foes in the second flight tracking the leaders into the far turn, steadily faded nearing upper stretch. COPPER FOREST angled to the inside early to track just off the pacesetter inside foes in the second flight, came through in upper stretch to challenge but lacked the needed final bid.

BOOM BOOM CHARLIE settled along the inside in the opening stages and never seriously menaced. CALL TO GLORY moved to the fore along the inside racing into the first turn dictating the pace under light rating, disputed the pace inside a rival racing through the far turn and gave way leaving midstretch.
