COLLIDIN was urged to secure the lead inside foes from the break, dictated the tempo on a narrow margin racing into the bend, dispatched his foes entering upper stretch and held sway to the end under firm encouragement. R RICH E. RICH, on terms with the pacesetter from the break, attended that rival's pace in hand in the opening quarter, pressed the issue on the turn, proved no match for the winner in the drive but held well for the place. DADDY FORTY NINE worked his way to the inside while gaining a position in the second flight, switched out three deep after a half to challenge but couldn't gain terms with the top pair. JACKS AGAIN was settled near the inside early, saved ground on the bend but never gained striking distance. BETTER MAKE MONEY angled inwards a bit in early stages to track the leaders outside a rival but never mounted a serious challenge. GUT KING was a brief factor tracking the leaders outside a rival in second flight, drifted out nearing the quarter mile marker and gave way.
