Footnotes

UNO CHAPO was guided to the rail in the opening quarter to secure a tracking position racing just off the leaders, continued unhurried along the inside to the far turn, shifted out to split foes three deep entering upper stretch and wrested command from NIC THE QUICK in late stages to prevail under firm handling. The latter moved in tandem with the winner racing to the first turn to gain a position outside that foe racing as part of the second flight to the backstretch, made steady progress to challenge three deep entering upper stretch, led between calls late but couldn't fend off his rival. SPIDER POWER (IRE) tracked the leaders unhurried between foes behind the second flight in the opening half, shifted out nearing the far turn to advance four deep racing into upper stretch but was outkicked by the top pair. TURNPIKE TOMMY dictated the pace along the inside from the outset, turned back a challenge to go clear in upper stretch but failed to sustain his momentum through the last furlong. CRATER MAKER bobbled a bit at the start, was quickly righted to stalk just outside the pacesetter to the backstretch, pressed that foe racing into upper stretch and gave way. MINISTER'S JOY was settled between foes in the opening half, shifted out a bit nearing upper stretch and made some belated progress three deep between foes. TOM ARCHDEACON, held up off the

second flight along the inside racing to the first turn, angled out entering the far turn while making some progress, swung five wide entering upper stretch but had no final response. DAVID K was held up along the inside in the opening stages while racing in some traffic entering the backstretch, saved ground while steadily moving into striking distance nearing midstretch but was shuffled a bit when racing in tight quarters nearest the rail in the last sixteenth. GROUND HERO, reserved in hand for a half, never gained contention. BROKERAGE HOUSE, caught three and four deep racing to the backstretch outside the second flight was spent after a half.
