GO DOUG GO, reserved along the inside racing behind the second flight in the opening stages, shifted off the inside midway through the turn while commencing his advance, angled four wide nearing upper stretch while challenging for command, took over leaving the furlong marker and was taken in hand in late stages once the issue was decided. BANK ACCOUNT broke readily to secure terms with a rival on the pace, attended that foe's tempo racing to the bend, moved to press the issue racing through the turn to gain a narrow advantage, couldn't fend off the winner's bid but continued with interest to hold a rival for place honors. SON OF TIGER tracked the leaders outside a rival in second flight racing to the turn, shifted out to bid three deep between foes nearing upper stretch, was caught in tight quarters passing the quarter mile marker but continued willingly to late stages to dispute second. MANO POINT, caught in tight quarters at the start, angled immediately to the rail racing well off the second flight, saved ground on the bend, shifted out to split foes racing through upper stretch but lacked the needed final kick. LITTLE FEAT settled into stride outside a rival early, angled four wide racing into the stretch but made no impression. HE'S HOT SAUCE shifted to the rail soon after the break to track the leaders in second flight but steadily faded entering upper stretch. GRAND ROW ducked inwards at the start momentarily impeding MANO POINT, was hustled between foes to strike the front in the opening furlong, dueled inside a rival racing into the turn and gave way leaving midstretch.
