KISSIT was well rated then split horses at the top of the stretch and accelerated then drew clear. DES MOINES set a pressured pace along the inside and emerged with the lead at the top of the stretch and held on to be second best. FLAPPER battled while three wide and raced through the long drive then held show. TANK GRRRL showed no speed and angled four wide then passed tiring rivals. GAUCHO GIRL rated in the middle of the pack and saved ground, running evenly. GOLD SPIKE pressed the pace and battled through the turn and gave way in the stretch. SUMMER RECITAL showed no speed and was no factor.
