Footnotes

PETAK MOUNTAIN was guided to the inside in early stages tracking off the second flight under rating, steadily gathered momentum while shifting off the inside on the second bend, split foes nearing upper stretch then shifted off five deep while being roused to challenge and produced a steady late response to edge HEART DOCTOR in time under firm handling. The latter, prominent along the inside in the opening stages, ceded the lead to a rival on the backstretch to attend that foe's pace along the rail under light rating, moved to regain the advantage racing into upper stretch, edged away to a clear advantage in late stages and just failed to contain the winner. ESOTERIC was guided to the inside early to track inside foes just off the second flight, saved ground to upper stretch, then shifted out of close quarters while being urged to challenge in the final sixteenth bumping OUR NOBLE HEART while narrowly prevailing for a share. PREOCCUPIED tracked the pace between foes leading the second flight on a narrow margin in the opening half racing just out of

striking distance, briefly awaited an opening nearing upper stretch, then came through close quarters three deep in late stages while being outfinished for a share. INIS OIRR settled outside foes in last racing to the backstretch, was fanned seven wide racing into the stretch but displayed some mild interest. KID CHIC tracked the leaders three deep in second flight in the opening half, made steady progress to challenge in that path on the far turn but flattened out nearing midstretch. OUR NOBLE HEART, forwardly placed outside a rival in the opening stages, forced the issue after a half to dictate the pace racing into the far turn, couldn't sustain that effort past the furlong marker, then was steadied out of tight quarters when bumped by ESOTERIC in late stages. OKLAHOMA HERO broke slowly, settled along the inside in the opening half, shifted off the rail racing into upper stretch but offered no rally. SILVER ROCK STAR tracked off the second flight outside foes early, was caught four wide midway through the backstretch while making some brief progress, then steadily faded racing into the stretch while caught six deep between rivals. H T H THIRTYSEVEN angled to the rail in early stages but soon dropped out.
