BLOND WARRIOR was urged to gain terms with a rival on the lead racing nearest the rail in the opening stages, attended that foe's tempo under light rating racing into the bend, wrested the advantage when given her cue nearing midstretch and moved well clear in the last furlong under firm encouragement. SPEEDY WAR joined the pace outside a rival soon after the break, pressed the pace into upper stretch but proved no match late while best of the others. HOLIDAY IN DIXIE settled into stride off the second flight four deep early, angled out five wide racing into upper stretch and continued well enough to edge several rivals for a share. WIN FRIENDLY, held up avoiding tight quarters at the start, was reserved off the second flight while angling nearer to the inside on the backstretch, shifted out to split foes nearing midstretch but continued evenly in late stages. SHARP TRIP angled to the inside to track the leaders in second flight racing into the turn but lacked the needed late response. LOST ACCOUNT tracked the pace outside a rival in the second flight racing into the bend, couldn't produce a closing bid then steadily faded three wide between foes in late stages. THUNDERING HOOFS settled into stride off the inside early and never seriously menaced.
