Footnotes

JILLUKE tracked the pace between foes in the second flight racing to the bend, angled three wide entering upper stretch while moving to challenge, took over leaving the furlong marker and edged clear under firm left handed pressure. FLAMING GLORY was urged to the fore three deep from the outset, forced the pace outside a rival into the bend, couldn't contain the winner late but prevailed for the place. HOLY THURSDAY, bumped at the start, tracked the leaders off the inside, angled four wide in upper stretch and produced his best stride late. BLYDE RIVER BOY, prominent between foes from the break, dueled for command inside a rival to upper stretch and weakened in late stages. SIG AND ZAG was settled off the inside, swung five wide entering upper stretch and passed tiring rivals. BOUNTY HUNTER broke inwards bumping HOLY THURSDAY, was collected off that foe to track the pace from the outside and steadily faded. STORMY BALLAD, forwardly placed along the inside in the opening stages, tracked just off the leaders along the rail and steadily faded.
