Footnotes

CORONET OF A BARON, on terms with the first flight four deep from the outset, attended the pace on his own courage racing three wide into the turn, lost some position to a rival entering upper stretch but continued with a steady response to wrest command from that foe in late stages and just held the late charge of NO GOOD DEED under firm right handed encouragement. The latter settled out of striking distance along the inside racing through the backstretch, switched outside a rival entering the turn while gradually gathering momentum, shifted out four deep nearing the furlong marker and found his best stride in the final sixteenth to just miss. WHAT DO YOU MEAN was urged to dispute the pace between foes from the outset, shifted to the rail nearing the turn while continuing to duel for command, edged forward to a clear advantage in upper stretch but couldn't sustain his momentum through the last furlong. CORAGIL CAT settled in hand off the inside to race in last to the turn, angled outside foes entering upper stretch and made some belated progress. JUST JEBICAH flashed brief pace inside foes contesting the lead in the opening furlong but was spent early. MAMBO GALLIANO vied for command three deep between foes in the opening stages, continued to dispute the issue between foes on the turn and gave way abruptly nearing midstretch.
