Footnotes

THE PIZZA MAN was settled out of striking distance while shifting nearer to the inside racing to the backstretch, steadily advanced on the second bend while angling out three deep, was fanned four wide racing into upper stretch while drawing on terms with the leaders and narrowly prevailed in the closing stages under strong handling in a prolonged drive. TAZZ shifted out in early stages to stalk just off the pacesetter under light rating racing to the backstretch, steadily drew on terms with the pacesetter on the far turn to challenge for command racing into upper stretch, gained a narrow advantage nearing midstretch and resisted the winner to the end while proving only second best. MAVERICKING tracked the leaders from just out of striking distance outside a rival under light rating in the opening half, was urged to challenge between rivals while shifting out three deep entering upper stretch, disputed the issue between foes past midstretch but couldn't quite match terms with the top pair. MR. MISCHIEF was urged to secure the lead while angling to the rail racing into the first turn, dictated the pace along the rail to the second bend but emptied out once headed entering upper stretch. FORBIDDEN FOREST tracked off the first flight inside a rival racing into the backstretch, came under pressure to advance racing into the far turn but had no closing response. DOUG JUNIOR, a bit outpaced in early stages, never mounted a serious challenge.
