### Footnotes

ALPHABET MAGIC broke readily to secure the lead racing to the first turn, dictated the pace inside a rival on a narrow margin into the far turn, was roused clear in upper stretch and held safe the challenge of DAVID K under some right handed pressure. The latter settled off foes in the opening stages, switched out entering the backstretch to race four wide, advanced to contention five wide on the far turn, then continued outside foes to the end to close the gap on the winner while always second best. FRANK'S TIME tracked unhurried off the second flight in the opening stages outside foes, advanced four wide entering the second bend to bid between foes racing into the stretch and continued willingly to earn a share. DADDY FORTY NINE, reserved inside foes off the second flight racing to the far turn, shifted out avoiding some traffic entering upper stretch and split foes to improve his position in late stages. PRINCETON HILLS was rated between foes racing as part of the second flight racing to the far turn, then continued evenly between foes three deep racing into the stretch. COUNTRY TOWN, urged to terms with the pacesetter racing to the first turn, attended the pace in hand for a half, pressed the issue through the far turn and gave way entering upper stretch. MINING FOR SILVER tracked just off the leaders in second flight inside foes racing to the far turn but couldn't produce the needed closing bid. TOM ARCHDEACON settled outside foes in the opening stages and never gained striking distance. COUNTRY ZIP was a brief factor stalking just off the leaders three deep racing to the far turn but quickly emptied out.
