Footnotes

IN CLASSIC FASHION, urged to the lead between foes from the break, angled to the rail nearing the turn while gaining a narrow advantage, dueled inside a rival into upper stretch and narrowly prevailed in a game performance. QUITE A DUDE, prominent four wide in the opening stages, pressed outside the winner racing into upper stretch, struck the front between calls in late stages but was outnodded. MCMURPHY settled outside foes in the opening stages, swung out five wide racing into the stretch and made some mild progress. STIG'S DEPUTY, prominent inside foes from the break, relinquished the lead to stalk just off the leaders on the rail, moved to close the gap in upper stretch, was caught in close quarters near the rail leaving the furlong marker then was outfinished for a share late. ALONE AT LAST tracked the leaders unhurried off the inside, advanced to challenge four wide between foes racing into the stretch but had no final kick. GRAND ROW, close up inside foes early, switched outside a rival to track the leaders on the turn, then steadily faded nearing the lane. HOLD'EM TIGER ducked inwards at the start and trailed the field to the lane.
