BREATHOFFRESHHEIR away in good order, vied for the lead, took over departing the half mile pole, set the pace from the two path, felt intensified pressure from the runner up approaching the quarter pole, responded positively once given her cut in upper stretch, came outward ever so slightly, brushing with SWEET SUSAN during the initial portion of the stretch drive, emerged from the furlong grounds with a clear advantage and held sway under intermittent urging. STATUS PENDING placed under a snug hold, was put to stronger handling after falling back a bit as the tempo quickened, leaving the half mile pole, was forced to be taken in hand, getting mildly shuffled from the five-sixteenths pole, angled out for clearance coming to the head of the stretch, then finished willingly to garner place honors. SWEET SUSAN underwent a three wide pursuit, made a bid for the lead coming to the quarter pole, wasn't up to the task, was brushed nearing the eighth pole and steadily weakened thereafter. NASHI vied for the lead from the inside, backed off soon after entering the turn, was set down to a steady diet of right handed smacks, but tired nonetheless during the stretch run. FLYING TRAIN eased back after being forwardly placed early, was taken back in hand when caught in a bit tight between rivals near the seven-sixteenths pole, attempted to reach contention with a three wide run from midway on the turn but flattened out. Claims of foul lodged by both the rider and trainer of SWEET SUSAN against the winner alleging interference in upper stretch were dismissed before the result was declared official.
