ANOTHER SILVER OAK bumped soundly at the start, recovered in short order and grabbed command before reaching the half mile pole, showed the way while taking the inside route, had the rider sit chilly, despite feeling some heat from RAECINJACIN coming to the quarter pole, shook that one off when let out a notch in upper stretch, was put to test a second time soon afterwards, when the runner up closed in, left the sixteenth pole, clinging to a narrow edge then dug in gamely to preserve it. WINNING WILDCAT took up chase from the three path, was set down coming to the three-eighths pole, began to close in during the latter stages of the run through the furlong grounds, drew alongside the top one to loom a serious threat with less than a sixteenth to go, continued on valiantly, but was fended off. THUNDERWAVE within striking distance during the initial half, angled off the inside turning for home for home, and displayed enough of a kick to grab the show. RAECINJASIN bumped at the start, sat patiently from the outside, just off the leader's hind quarters during the early going, moved up willingly departing the backstretch, bid for the lead coming to the quarter pole, was shaken off and steadily weakened during the final eighth. JERRY THE MUSH urged from the gate, was taken in hand after assuming a forward position, chased the pacesetter for a half and tired. HARDSHELL was bumped soundly between rivals at the start, left the backstretch from the three path, was asked for run in the vicinity of the five-sixteenths pole, but offered little.
