OPENING MOVE broke well and went on to the front, was taken over to the inside in short order, had the runner up drew alongside proceeding to the half mile pole, sparred with that one, with the riders of both horses coaxing their mounts to maintain interest, was the first of the two front runners to commit to a drive, doing so just before reaching the quarter pole and having dropped back just a sliver at that point, battled back to get his head in front once more as the pair made their way from upper to midstretch, began to edge away approaching the sixteenth pole, then kicked well clear departing that station under good handling. QUICK MONEY appeared eager for early action, was given some rein down the backstretch and went on to confront the eventual winner, went head to head with that opponent from just past the half mile pole to just prior to the sixteenth pole, with both front runners holding the slimmest of advantages at one time or another during the tussle, got asked for more in the vicinity of the three-sixteenths pole, remained on nearly even terms for an additional furlong, fell back steadily thereafter and had to settle for being second best. BLACK PEN chased the disputed pace from well off the inside, got placed in the four path in preparation for the drive, was under urging turning for home, proved no match for the embattled pair up ahead. SOVEREIGN DEFAULT raced along the outside, sat within striking distance of the duel around the turn, was under a drive heading into the lane, lacked the necessary stretch response. STRATEGIC MOVE tracked the pace fight while taking the inside route, altered course to be outside of the top pair at the three-sixteenths pole, failed go gain ground. MIAMI MAKO underwent a three wide pursuit, was through after going a half.
