Footnotes

LATE STARTER stumbled at the start, but was still the first of the quintet to pop out of the starting gate, sat forwardly placed along the rail while racing as a team with PLEASANT PRINCE during the opening quarter, had the previously mentioned foe go on with it and take over, was tipped into the two path as soon as the leader was sent over to the inside, this occurring midway down the backstretch, keenly moved up to engage that opponent, rider atop with a firm grip on the reins, changed plans and was eased back slightly rather than dispute the pace from between rivals once BEST ACTOR become more prominently placed, got taken three wide at the half mile pole and was given some rein, took off with a good burst of speed, overpowering more frantically-urged ones to take charge before reaching the quarter pole, was nearly a sixteenth farther down the road when asked for a response, gave it willingly, emerging from the furlong grounds holding his biggest advantage, had plenty of time in the late stages to reach the wire first and hold off the runner up's late charge. CITIZEN WELLS off the inside, loped along until the half mile pole, widest of all for a good portion down the backstretch, remained off the rail upon entering the far turn while starting to pick up interest, got set down spinning into the stretch, tipped a bit wider during the initial portion of the stretch run and came home with good late foot, but too late to threaten the winner. IDLE AMERICAN lumbered out of the starting gate, rode the rail until approaching the quarter pole, was put to solid encouragement angling out three wide, lacked the needed stretch response. PLEASANT PRINCE vied for the lead from the outside on the opening bend, kicked clear shortly after entering the backstretch and tucked along the rail, yielded readily to the winner's strong move despite getting asked for run, tired. BEST ACTOR became the primary pursuer once the eventual winner was allowed to ease back, kept up the pressure from the outside until the three-eighths pole, folded.
