Footnotes

NO DETOUR broke well and assumed a forward position, contested the pace from the two path while being rated along, turned for home latched onto to GOLDEN WEEKEND and was set down to a hard drive, gained little if any ground making his way to the eighth pole, picked up real estate more readily thereafter, wore down his fellow pace combatant in the final seventy yards, then dug in well enough and long enough to narrowly turn back the late challenge coming from the second place finisher. MARSH DAWG chased the ongoing pace fight from the outside, was asked for run midway on the turn and raced in tandem with DUFFY'S TAVERN glued to the inside towards the front runners, found his best stride leaving the furlong marker, displayed a late surge, but came up short. GOLDEN WEEKEND argued for control with the winner from the rail, needed some encouragement by the five-sixteenths pole to maintain a slim advantage, held his ground well from upper stretch to midstretch, had the top one cut into the margin slowly, but steadily thereafter, yielded reluctantly in the late stages. RUFFINO three wide, had a mild stretch response. KEECHI BULLET was steadied when squeezed between rivals at the start, darted to rail soon afterwards but was off the inside for the run around the bend, failed to reach a contending position. DUFFY'S TAVERN came out slightly after bobbling at the start, took the inside route tracking the disputed pace, raced as a team with MARSH DAWG, under strong encouragement, from the three-eighths pole, could make no headway on the front runners. SCORCH THE TORCH made contact with KEECHI BULLET soon after the start, was taken in hand, when in tight as another crossed over towards the inside near the seven-sixteenths pole, tired after completing a half.
