SENIORS PRIDE away well from the starting gate, was immediately taken out to the two path when displaced on the front end by ENDYMION, patiently stalked that opponent from the two path, while being rated along, continued on the same scenario for nearly three-quarters, moved up to pressure the leader nearing the quarter pole, was set down, now bidding in earnest after being straightened away in upper stretch, fought his way to the slimmest of margins hitting the eighth pole, edged away to a clear, but still short advantage during the ensuing sixteenth, appeared vulnerable for a moment when the runner up loomed boldly at that station, but continued on stubbornly to preserve the decision. MORE THAN A REASON raced three wide around the second turn, was put to encouragement from the five-sixteenths pole, drew alongside the top one with a sixteenth to go, but could make no additional headway. MASALA was put to a snug hold a few jumps out of the starting gate, raced in the two under patient handling from the rider, made up some ground during the latter stages of the run around the second bend, was finally asked for a response in the vicinity of the three-sixteenths pole, drifted out to the middle of the track during the next furlong, then flashed belated interest to salvage show honors. ENDYMION was urged to the front, cut the pace from the inside, remained a prominent factor until midstretch and steadily weakened thereafter. CRIMSON COMIC forwardly placed for six furlongs, while three wide around both turns, gave way.
