**Footnotes**

BEAUTIFUL BUT BLUE broke well, set the pace along the inside in hand and under very little pressure, was let out at the head of the lane, drew away, drifted in slightly shying from the whip along her right side near the eighth pole, continued on kept to task driving. PEGGY JANE tracked the front in hand from the two path, began to press the pace setter near the three-eighths when coming under light hand urging, came under a drive at the quarter pole, saw her rival lengthen away through the initial portion of the stretch, continued on with good energy to narrow the gap through the final eighth while safe for the place. MISCHIEF MAKER lunged at the break, was steadied soon after before making contact with her inside rival, fought the bit into the clubhouse turn while keen and resisting the hold applied by the rider, was allowed to settle down in midpack, came under coaxing near the five-sixteenths, advanced steadily from the two path, was set down at the head of the lane and rallied for show honors. I BET TONI KNOWS chased three wide throughout, was coaxed along early, came under a full drive at the head of the lane and offered up a mild kick. MARLINS ROSE rear early, saved ground throughout, was pushed along from the five-sixteenths and offered little. BIRD HOUSE tracked the front along the rail while well rated and prominent, steadily faded after a half. HOT SPLASH off the pace saving ground throughout, came under a busy ride near the seven-sixteenths, cut the corner into the lane and tired. PROUD AND CHARMING urged along at the back of the pack, was under a prolonged hand ride approaching the head of the stretch, swung four wide and made no headway.
