SEEKING ANITA was carried out a bit by MONTE at the start, was grabbed hold and put back into stride, worked his way towards the rail, took the inside route around the turn, cut the corner under a drive, was taken off the inside just past the three-sixteenths pole, forged on towards the front runners, split rivals en route to taking charge at the sixteenth pole, then dug in stubbornly to stave off the fast-closing runner up in time to preserve the decision. JAX MAXX was placed in the two path upon reaching the half mile pole, was asked to pick up the pace under some hand urging in the vicinity of the five-sixteenths pole, angled three wide for the stretch drive, made little progress during the ensuing furlong, then finding his best stride at the eighth pole, closed fast, only to run out of real estate. SCORCH THE TORCH left alertly to establish command, was rated along the inside while setting the pace, clung to a narrow lead, despite drifting outward several paths from the quarter pole to the furlong marker, finally relinquished during the final sixteenth but held well enough to the wire to take the show. BACKCOUNTRY BOY settled into midpack, despite receiving some urging leaving the gate, stayed within range near the two path during the opening half, ducked inward in the vicinity of the three-sixteenths pole, got outkicked during the late stages. TRACKMENS STAR stumbled at the break, went on to stalk the leader under a firm hold, crept forward, departing the backstretch, with the rider still attempting to keep something in reserve, challenged for the lead heading for the stretch, but backed off leaving the furlong grounds. MONTE broke outward, underwent a three wide pursuit and tired.
