BUCKEYE HEART raced from off the inside, was set down in the vicinity of the five-sixteenths pole, swung three wide into the stretch but kept going wider until in the five path midway through the furlong grounds, settled into his best stride departing the eighth pole, fought outside another pair in the late stages for command and got there. DAN'S GOLD tracked the front runners from the pocket, lightly coaxed along to keep pace, was asked for run commencing to swing outward approaching the head of the stretch, was four wide by midlane, moved up willingly to confront LITTLE DALE, vied from between rivals in the late stages and came up short. LITTLE DALE stalked the front runners while racing primarily three wide on the turn, was put to encouragement spinning into the lane, forged past an embattled pair to arrive at the furlong marker in possession of a slim advantage, wasn't able to shake free, came under attack by the first two finishers during the final sixteenth, got nailed by each of them at the finish line. WHY ARGUE was rated in the two path while prompting the pacesetter, got called upon turning for home, had LITTLE DALE arrived on the scene shortly afterwards, fought for control from between rivals from upper stretch until a few strides away from the sixteenth pole, then weakened. BROOKLYN RED brushed after the start, lacked the needed response. TAPROOT took the inside route on the the turn, paused when caught in a minor traffic situation coming to the quarter pole, tipped three wide for the start of the stretch run, had no discernable rally. MISSILEWHILEUWORK argued for the lead along the inside, came under heavier pressure once LITTLE DALE joined the dispute in the early stages of the stretch drive, surrendered before completing the next furlong and backed away. CLASSIC R AND B made light contact with BROOKLYN RED a short distance out the gate, was guided over to the rail at the end of the backstretch, trailed.
