ANNUAL APPEAL, the leader by default after the runner up's poor beginning, was eased back and readily surrendered command midway down the backstretch, was immediately put into the two path once that chore had been accomplished, bided time, under a good hold during the run around the second bend, bid in earnest after settling into upper stretch, fought her way to the front, poking a head on top with an eighth to go, then dug in stubbornly to stave off CODY SAMORA to prevail. CODY SAMORA stumbled badly at the break, made a three wide around the first turn to eventually take up residence on the lead, taking over from a willing ANNUAL APPEAL, set moderate fractions from the inside, on an open lead, came under attack from the top one just the quarter pole, fell a head behind after the run through the furlong grounds, tried to mount a comeback under steady left handed pressure but wasn't up to the task. RIVER FANCY three wide around the far turn, was asked for some run in the vicinity of the five-sixteenths pole, and gained ground gradually on the top twosome. E Z PASSER unhurried for nearly three-quarters, turned for home four wide and rallied mildly. TRIBECA rode the rail, angled outward at the quarter pole, and failed to fire once called upon.
