Footnotes

MALIBU MOONSHINE angled to the rail soon after the start, saved ground while trailing for six furlongs, angled three wide in upper stretch and finished with a flourish to win going away. TAKE THE BLUFF saved ground in good position, angled three wide on the far turn, battled heads apart leaving the quarter pole, gained a brief lead in deep stretch but couldn't hold the winner safe. LIKE NOW dueled inside early, moved out after a half, took the lead on the turn, led into deep stretch and yielded late. RISES THE PHOENIX raced in the three path for a half, ranged up four wide to reach contention on the turn and flattened out. NUMAANY steadied on the first turn, was under a firm hold to the far turn and lacked a further response. YIELD BOGEY was used up setting the early pace.
