REDWOOD FEVER away alertly, was taken in hand, contently conceding the front to the runner up, maneuvered into the two path just before reaching the opening bend, patiently stalked the pacesetter, perched just off that opponent's hind quarters until the three-sixteenths pole, followed suit, being asked for run after FIVE ACES was, went by under hand encouragement and edged away, remaining under hand encouragement until the final few strides. FIVE ACES out broke the field, and angled sharply towards the rail, was rated on the front, slightly off the inside and under the watchful eye of the top one all the while, was asked for a response coming to the three-sixteenths pole, relinquished the lead leaving the eighth pole but continued onward with good energy to be clearly second best. SHOTGUN BANDIT well positioned tracking the pacesetter from the pocket throughout the opening three-quarters, proved no match for the top twosome. UNBRIDLED GRIT four wide around both turns, had no kick. EVEN FRISKY saved ground until the eighth pole. R J'S PROSPECT three wide around the first turn, was no factor. BINDLE STICK settled into midpack off the inside before reaching the first turn, checked while appearing eager soon after entering the backstretch, was steadied twice more before reaching the half mile pole, bumped lightly with a rival midway on the second turn, turned for home still off the inside but had no solid punch to deliver. NEXT DAY raced along the outside and was outrun. HEIR RAISER underwent a three wide journey, lugged in slightly around the three-eighths pole bumping lightly with BINDLE STICK, was through after completing three-quarters.
