EASTER GIFT brushed soon after the start, raced along the outside, was between rivals from the top of the far turn until the five-sixteenths pole, had the member to his outside drop back at that juncture, angled out slightly and was set down to a drive, gradually worked his way to be outside the front runners by the furlong marker, continued the pursuit of the embattled pair a short distance up ahead, collared the winner of that tussle and edged away in the final seventy yards, crossing the wire under a very vigorous hand ride. SUMMER SUNSET made light contact with the winner a few strides out of the starting gate, went on to assume a forward position, was rated while stalking the pacesetter, taking up the chore from the two path, ranged up to increase his presence approaching the quarter pole, was the first of the front runners to have the pilot commit to some kind of encouragement, doing so a couple of jumps before reaching the head of the stretch, gained and afterwards clung to a slim advantage during an intensified duel that lasted until near the sixteenth pole, got confronted by the top one in the late stages, yielded but continued on willingly for second. SPA CITY FEVER grabbed command by the end of the homestretch, cut the pace, well rated from the rail for the opening six furlongs, had the runner up range up during the later stages of the run around the far turn, waited a little longer before getting called upon, fought with vigor but soon surrendered the lead, battled onward before tiring in the final sixteenth. JAGUAR PAW underwent a ground-saving journey, closed the gap on the front runners making the way down the backstretch, stayed within range for most of the way on the far turn, was under a drive cutting the corner into the lane, faltered. KINGS VILLAGE three wide around both turns, trailed.
