CAYAMBE unhurried but well within range of a contested pace, was put into the three path midway around the turn, moved up and challenged in earnest as the widest of four front runners, sprinted away to a comfortable advantage making his way from upper to midstretch, extended the lead, remained well in the clear, geared down for the final seventy yards. QUICK MONEY sat three wide of a duel, ranged up to issue a bid coming to the quarter pole, poked a head down in front heading for home, with the eventual winner bearing down hard to his outside, proved no match and yielded quickly. CAT IN THE FOREST well rated from the two path just behind an embattled pair, was bottled up in traffic for much of the way from three-eighths pole to the end of the far turn, entered the stretch and was tipped outward to be three to four wide by a sixteenth later, made no headway on the top two finishers. WAR COLONY placed four wide at the head of the stretch, was no menace. PLEASEANDTHANKYOU lost his footing leaving the gate and bumped with OBVIOUSLY TUESDAY, went on to engage in a tussle with the same foe, needed to be roused halfway around the bend to keep pace, neared the quarter pole facing heavy pressure and succumbed to it. OBVIOUSLY TUESDAY was bumped at the start, disputed the pace from the outside for a half and gave way.
