SAGINAW strung out near the middle of the track by UNDERSTATEMENT while making his way down the homestretch, was still at least two wide for the run around the opening bend, powered by the aforementioned rival without need of encouragement to take charge before reaching the backstretch, took up residence at a slight distance off the rail, set the splits from there, with the rider applying a firm hold on the reins, began to draw off from the trailing trio after going six furlongs, proceeded down the lane handily to win with authority. DAY OF DESTINY raced along the outside, was asked for a response at the three-eighths pole and was along for the place. TAP ATTACK broke slowly, took the inside route for nearly three-quarters, proved no match. UNDERSTATEMENT three wide approaching the first turn, settled closer to the inside upon reaching it, was taken hold and eased back, conceding the advantage to the winner, chased from a slight distance behind until the five-sixteenths pole then gave way.
