Footnotes

INDIAN LILLY was knocked sideways by PARADISE BY THE C a short distance from the starting gate, recovered and assumed a forward position, left the backstretch from the three path, remained unhurried for most of the way around the bend, bid, still under a good hold and closer to the inside, approaching the quarter pole, turned for home with a slim edge, lengthened away to her biggest advantage during the run through the furlong grounds, then was kept busy, reaching the wire in time to preserve the decision. GIN CAT reserved towards the inside during the initial stages, left the rail coming to the three-eighths pole, spun four wide for the stretch, then closed with good energy down the center of the strip to miss. SUDDEN IMPULSE was bumped a couple of jumps after the start, took up position in midpack, commenced a bid leaving the five-sixteenths pole, reached the top one's left flank by the sixteenth pole but could make no additional progress. IN HER HEY DAY set the early pace from the inside, offered brief resistance before yielding to the eventual winner and steadily tired thereafter. PARADISE BY THE C was knocked into the top one after making contact with LADY MAUREEN just out of the starting gate, sat reserved along the outside, was released from the firm hold in the vicinity of the three-eighths pole, angled three wide into the lane but lacked the necessary stretch response. LADY MAUREEN bumped after the start, chased the pacesetter towards the two path for almost a half and folded.
