SENIORS PRIDE broke sharply from the starting gate, set the splits from the rail with the runner up making his presence felt all the while in the two path, had that rival look him in the eye upon reaching the far turn, went head to head for nearly the whole way around it, was set down to a drive spinning into the lane, clinging desperately to a narrow advantage and with GOOMBADA GUSKA lurking a major danger from the three path at this juncture, inched away from both rivals during the run through the furlong grounds, was unable to shake free however, had that margin dwindle down to almost nothing, but showed good determination to reach the wire first. SPA CITY FEVER away in good order, took up the role of stalker nearly from the get-go, was under a firm hold in the opening half while prompting the top one, ranged up to draw on even terms in the vicinity of the seven-sixteenths pole, matched stride for stride with the winner from that station to the quarter pole, got called upon as did SENIORS PRIDE, lost a slight amount of real estate during the ensuing furlong, refused to back off, came back sliver by sliver in the last eighth, but had to settle for a well-earned place award. GOOMBADA GUSKA unhurried for the initial half, was placed three wide in preparation for the stretch run, had dead aim on the front runners throughout the lane, but could make no headway on either one. LINEBACKER raced along the outside, drifted four wide into the stretch while tiring.
