DEALING LUCKY off to an alert beginning, briefly sought the front, before being eased back, underwent a three wide pursuit on turn, turned three wide for home under a drive, gained readily on the leader, reached even terms at the sixteenth pole, grabbed a narrow advantage a couple of jumps later and maintained it in the late stages in a confident manner. KARAKORUM ON BLACK forwardly placed right from the start, contently stalked the pacesetter towards the two path, was coaxed along from midway on the turn to keep pace, took off with a quick move, aided by a few hard right handed smacks from the stick coming to the quarter pole, left the three-sixteenths pole with a clear lead, offered good resistance as the top one closed in, relinquished just past the sixteenth pole but continued on willingly for the place. LEAP DAY off a beat slowly, was rushed up the rail to take charge, cut the pace under the watchful eye of the runner up, came under sudden assault coming to the quarter pole, lost the lead turning for home, and steadily weakened thereafter. KILN CREEK swung four wide into the lane and lacked the necessary stretch response. WADI SUKI was taken off the inside in the vicinity of the seven-sixteenths pole, in essence flip flopping paths with HALF A NOTE at that station, came wide for the stretch drive, settled in the five path when the maneuver was completed but had no offering. HALF A NOTE guided to the rail at the seven-sixteenths pole and faltered. INCREDIBLE SPEED saved ground and trailed.
