QUICK MONEY established command soon after the start, easily fended off a more energetically-handled pursuer throughout the opening half, then drew off for a convincing score, under a mild hand ride from the quarter pole to the wire. SOUND CHASER outrun for a half, rallied belatedly to grab the place. TYMPANIC three wide at the half mile pole, was along for the show. ASHLEY'S MISSION lost some ground and position angling wide into the lane, then staged a mild comeback improving by tired ones to grab the last major award. PAVLOV'S DOG chased from afar and was through after completing a half. ZEN VILLAGE urged chasing the winner from the two path, gave way. LOGICAL ORDER saved ground and was always outrun.
