**Footnotes**

KENTUCKY PIE raced rankly, fighting with vigor on the bit in resistance to being rated throughout the initial quarter, had the pilot check hard prior to leaving the first turn, was placed as the widest of all down the backstretch shortly afterwards, settled down significantly before reaching its end, started out four wide but was in the three path for most of the way around the far turn, challenged in earnest as the widest of three frontrunners spinning into the lane, poked a head down in front by the eighth pole, slowly but steadily edged away, crossing the finish line under a strong hand drive. SINISTRA three wide on the opening bend, remained off the inside but closer to the rail during the next half, had a good finish down the center of the strip to garner the place. WARRIOR JAMES inadvertently drifted slightly outward in the initial stages, making contact with PERFECT SUNDAY as a result, showed no ill effects from the incident and took command, was sent over to the rail, showed the way, facing honest resistance all the while, was pressed by a pair of foes from the three-eighths pole until midstretch, yielded then weakened in the late stages. CANDY RAIDER under a full drive swinging five wide into upper stretch, showed some willingness once straightened away en route for the last major check. BEELINER broke open the gate, was backed out, examined by the veterinarian and reloaded, proceeded to come out without apparent mishap, sat forwardly placed three wide until midway on the far turn, had the eventual winner arrive on the scene at that juncture, was put some urging and vied for command from between rivals until the furlong marker before backing away. BUGSY LOSTY saved ground on the first turn, tipped to be two wide on the subsequent one, failed to reach a contending position. TWEET ME off the inside for a good portion of the opening six furlongs, gave way. PERFECT SUNDAY stumbled after bumping into the hind quarters of WARRIOR JAMES a short distance out of the starting gate, tucked along inside, went on to save ground thereafter while trailing.
