OUR ELI unhurried early on while bidding time saving ground, improved position in the turn on the front, swung four wide at the quarter pole looming the outermost of a quartet in close range for the stretch drive, was set down and rallied, drifted in in the final eighth despite the rider's attempts to keep a straight course and inched clear to prevail. JOHARDY vied for command early on when it appeared no one wanted to commit to the front, came under coaxing in tandem with MAD BOMBER at the five-sixteenths, matched strides with that rival to the eighth pole when joined on the front by the eventual winner and LONE STAR GOLD, fought on through the final furlong to garner place honors by a determined nose. LONE STAR GOLD chased the pace four wide through the turn, turned for home three wide and under a drive, was among a foursome within a length of each other with an eighth remaining, ran on with good energy for show honors. MAD BOMBER chased initially three wide in close pursuit through the turn, came under urging and raced as a team with JOHARDY from the five-sixteenths pole to the three- sixteenths with the slimmest of leads, was displaced at that station, battled on through the stretch, yielding in the late stages and settling for the last major share. MY PAL OF PALS under a firm hold early on, chased the pace from towards the rear and was never a threat. FRISKY CAT vied inside for command under light hand coaxing until the seven-sixteenths and steadily gave way.
