Footnotes

REAL GLORY reserved from off the inside down the backstretch, was let out a notch upon reaching the turn, rapidly gained ground on the embattled pair up ahead, was forced three wide at the five-sixteenths pole when beaten to position by HOOKIN THE GOODS, who had just angled out herself at that juncture, continued to make progress on the front runners, spun into the stretch the widest of a threesome only heads apart from each other, soon took over, edged away under strong handling, extended the winning margin thereafter, kept to a drive. SOLDIERETTE broke well and got engaged in a spirited duel with SHALAKA almost from the get-go, tussled with that foe towards the middle of the strip for much of the way down the backstretch before shadowing the previously mentioned rival closer to the inside by the half mile pole, stubbornly kept her head in front from the two path during the run around the bend, had the eventual winner join the fracas by the quarter pole, relinquished soon afterwards, unable to match strides with the fresher challenger, continued on with good courage to be clearly second best. LUCK IN THE CITY rode the rail, cut the corner into the lane under a drive, got angled outward during the initial portion of the stretch run, was closing in fast on a tiring rival's heels approaching the eighth pole when altered sharply back to the rail, proved no match for the top pair. SHALAKA sparred with the runner up from the inside until upper stretch and gave way. HOOKIN THE GOODS tracked the ongoing pace dispute while taking the inside route, vacated the premises at the five-sixteenths pole, securing the two path before the top one could, came up empty for the stretch drive.
