Footnotes

BIGSHOTINTHENEWS took the overland route, got asked to pick up the pace coming to the five-sixteenths pole, was still far off the inside turning for home, got straightened away and took off in earnest after the front runners, made little progress during the initial portion of the stretch run, but more than made up for the lack of progress thereafter, got to within a good striking distance by deep stretch, continued onward with good courage, grabbing the lead prior to the wire. SAY MR. SANDMAN stalked the pacesetter from off the inside, was already under encouragement turning for home three wide, cut into the leader's margin readily after departing the backstretch, and continued on with good energy to secure second. TRAMICI BAY bobbed yet still out broke the field, was clear of the competition in short order and dashed over to the rail, set the pace on a loosely-contested lead, was asked for a response after completing the opening half, still held a healthy advantage with an eighth to go, saw the margin dwindle steadily, finally getting caught a short distance from the finish line. PATRIOTTOWN was unhurried stalking the leader, got let out a notch upon reaching the turn and ranged up towards the front end, issued an abbreviated challenge coming to the quarter pole before flattening out. THE KENOSHA KID saved ground until upper lane, displayed only a mild stretch response. EVEN GOT QUIET bumped hard with SELJUK at the break, was quickly guided over to the rail, cut the corner into the stretch, remained a prominent factor for an additional furlong then weakened. CYBERTRON raced very wide and greenly, with the rider applying a strong grip on left side to counteract a tendency to come outward during various stages of the initial half. SELJUK bumped soundly at the break, raced from off the inside, was under a drive by the five-sixteenths pole, but could make no headway on the front runners. JOHN JOE out a step leaving the starting start, was grabbed hold, was five wide at the midway point on the turn, angled inward a couple of paths soon afterwards, tired after going a half. VERDE MONT urged chasing the leader, folded. FIDDLERS PADRE underwent a three wide pursuit, was asked for a response in the vicinity of the five-sixteenths pole, but had little left to offer. PINPON was always far back.
