Footnotes

COALTOWN LEGEND spotted the field several lengths at the start, after getting away awkwardly, rejoined the pack under some light urging soon afterwards, tracked the front runners from afar down the backstretch, began to pick up pace under coaxing leaving the seven-sixteenths pole, angled four wide under much stronger encouragement into upper stretch, closed in on the leader, collared that rival in the vicinity of the sixteenth pole, blew by and drew off under good handling. WICKED CLIMB kept in the two path, vied with a pair of rivals around the turn, shook them off heading for the top of the stretch but with a fully roused COALTOWN LEGEND starting to bear down, succumbed to that one's pressure with a sixteenth to go but held well enough to the end to take second. OVEREXTENDED outrun for a half, commenced to rally from the five path at the top of the lane and finished with good energy to be along for the show. LEAP DAY left the backstretch from the four path, contested the pace with a pair of opponents, the widest of the threesome, during the run around the bend, was asked for run to keep pace midway during the skirmish, backed away soon after entering the stretch. FRENCH TRANSITION was never involved. PRIX DE KARAKORUM three wide, disputed the pace between foes until nearly the quarter pole, then drifted out steadily in the stretch while tiring.
