Footnotes

PROWLER raced under a good hold down the backstretch, chose to take the overland route for the run around the bend, ranged up to the pacesetter, swung for home, the widest of a tight-bunched group only heads apart, and with the only missing of the race, lurking dangerously on hold, well within striking distance, showed the most after being asked for a response, took charge by the furlong marker, then held off the runner up with good determination to preserve the decision. MONTE was asked early by rider to keep pace, chased the front runner four wide on the turn, went up to test that one, directly to the inside of the eventual winner, was shaken off by that rival during the next furlong, continued on with good courage to hold off READING GROUP for the place. READING GROUP was unhurried during the initial going, stayed within range needed only slight urging to do so, was kept on hold, stuck behind a wall of opponents spread across four deep, from the five-sixteenths pole to the quarter pole, was asked for run spinning into the stretch, altered course to the outside to steer clear of the foursome, still blocking optimal racing clearance, directly up ahead, then rallied willingly to take the show. CON THE CAT vied from the three path and gave way. MARKET ANALYSIS vied for the lead while deliberately kept off the inside, came under heavy pressure approaching the quarter pole and soon succumbed.
